

Chem Waste Wants to Expand their Toxic Waste Dump

KETTLEMAN CITY SAYS NO!!

FACT:

Chemical Waste Management's Kettleman Hills Facility is one of the largest hazardous waste landfills in the country.

FACT:

If Chem Waste gets their way, they will add 74 acres to their current hazardous waste landfill, making a total of 127 acres; a **140% increase!**

FACT:

Currently, Chem Waste's Kettleman Hills Facility accepts **2500 tons per day of hazardous waste**, 600 tons per day of contaminated soil, and 1400 tons per day of municipal waste.

FACT:

Chem Waste is not Kettleman City's only pollution problem. Along with year-round pesticide application, a new concern is a recently approved project for Westlake Farms Inc. to run a 1000 acre sewage-sludge composting facility, 7.6 miles from the Kettleman Hills Facility. Westlake Farms would take up to **500,000 wet tons per year of sewage sludge** (which includes some industrial waste) from Los Angeles County.
